



Dear Parents, Carers, Governors and Friends,

Year 4 had a fantastic time at PGL last weekend, they arrived back late on Sunday evening looking tired and very slightly grubby! Please look on the website to see photos of their experience. A very big thank you to all of the staff who gave up their weekend to give the children such an amazing time.

Year 6 show cased their Isle of Wight experience in their family Assembly this morning. Each child received a certificate celebrating something they had achieved while on the trip, all of which were very well deserved.

Two moderators from the borough of Greenwich spent yesterday at Raglan, looking at the writing of our Year 6 children and talking to myself, Ms Wood and the Year 6 teachers to decide whether they agreed with the judgements we had made about the children's writing. It was an extremely positive experience, they were very impressed with the quality of the writing and with how well the teachers knew each of the children. I am very pleased to say that all of our judgements were agreed and they considered there was enough evidence to move two more children's writing from expected standard to greater depth, which was great news. A very well done to all of the children in Year 6 who have been so focussed on their learning all year and have all done their very best. Thank you to the Year 6 team who have done a fantastic job in supporting the children to do their very best and to Ms Wood who has also worked with many of the children.

We are very proud of our Year 1 children who took their phonic screening assessment this week. They have all made such progress this year and are becoming confident and enthusiastic readers which is so great to see.

Scott George, our Chair of Governors, spent yesterday morning in Year 2 observing English and Mathematic lessons and talking to the children about their learning. He was very impressed with the quality of the learning and with how well all of the adults in Year 2 work together to ensure every child makes progress.

Last night we had our first ever Raglan Jazz event, organised by our music teacher Fiona McSorley. It was a fantastic evening and the quality of the music was truly exceptional. Thank you to everyone who was able to attend and to Ms McSorley for organising it.

Today we had our first Invacuation (Lockdown) Practice. We had talked about it in assembly earlier in the week so that when the siren sounded the children knew exactly what to do. The whole process went very smoothly and the school was safely 'locked down' in under 3 minutes. Thank you to everyone for their support with this.

Finally may I please ask that parents supervise their children in the playground after school. With the warm weather most of the After School clubs are taking place in the playground and it is very difficult for the coaches who are taking the clubs, if children are allowed to run through the middle of the area where they are setting up.

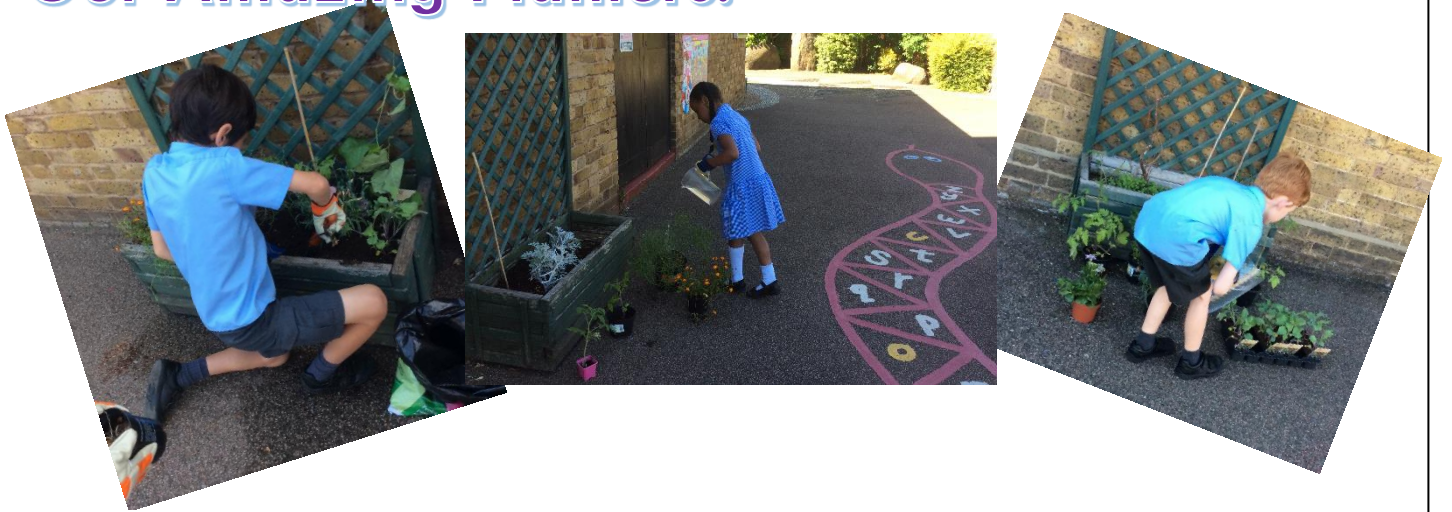
