We took the decision not to talk about what had happened in assembly, as we did not want to worry the children unnecessarily. If children raised the subject, teachers had age-appropriate conversations with them, answered their questions and offered reassurance.

On a more positive note, our teaching staff met with teachers from Valley Primary, Crofton Infant School and Crofton Junior School to look at the learning from across the three schools. Teachers in each year group shared examples of their children's writing to ensure that we all had the same understanding and expectations about what made writing at the expected standard and what made writing at greater depth. Next term she will be working with some children from Year 1 and Year 2.
