Pupil Premium is the additional funding schools receive to support pupils from 'disadvantaged backgrounds' to enjoy and achieve in line with all other children. This includes pupils who are entitled to Free School meals (or have been at some point in the last six years), Children in Care, adapted children and Children of Service Personnel.

The government believes that allocating Pupil Premium funding is the best way to raise the attainment of 'disadvantaged pupils'. It is up to the school to decide how the pupil Premium is spent.

The following information enables parents and carers to see how much funding the school is receiving, how the school is spending the money and its impact on attainment and progress of pupils.

Please note that the funding we receive is not sufficient to provide all of this support for all pupils; The support is allocated according to need.  At Raglan School children receive the support they need to succeed, regardless of whether or not they are entitled to Pupil Premium Funding.

The table below sets out how we have allocated our Pupil Premium Allocation

Intervention	Cost per annum	Proposed Impact
Teacher led targeted additional support in reading, writing and maths	£18,900 (20 weeks x 3 days)	To accelerate the progress of pupils in reading, writing and maths
Considered deployment of support staff in reading, writing and maths	£16,380	To accelerate the progress of pupils in reading, writing and maths
Funky Fingers Group	£936	To support children with development of fine motor skills
Touch type Read and Spell	£936	To improve self-esteem by learning to read, write and spell with confidence while learning to touch type.
Phonic Intervention- Small group and 1:1 tuition of phonics	£3,390	To accelerate progress in reading for those children who leave Year 1 with below average phonic awareness
Play leader to provide supported structured play	£1,950	To improve children's wellbeing by giving them a range of activities that develop their social and communication skills
Additional EP visit per term	£1,350	To improve the learning outcomes by identifying areas that may be hindering learning and to suggest possible strategies to improve learning outcomes
Additional day of learning Mentor time	£5,187	To provide support and guidance to pupils who are experiencing difficulties in learning due to social, emotional or behavioural challenges to enable them to make at least expected progress
Financial Assistance for Residential Trips	£600	To promote confidence building and team building skills
Financial Assistance for Music Lessons	£900	To promote enjoyment of music
Lego Therapy Group	£312	To support children's communication and problem solving skills
