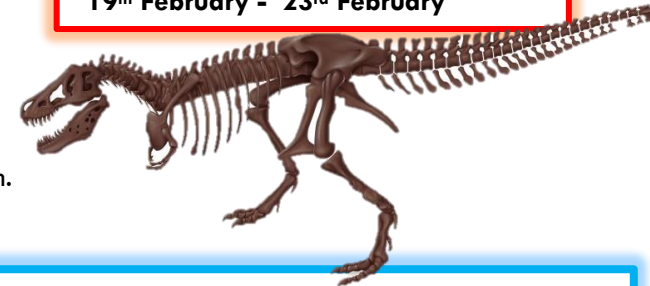

How can you help at home?

In Maths, we are working on explaining our thinking, so talking through problems given and getting your child to tell you how they did it would be an excellent way to support their learning.

On Wednesday and Thursday evenings encourage your child to do their thinking home learning so they are ready for Big Writing on Friday – this really helps them to organise their writing so they can concentrate on developing their grammar, vocabulary and punctuation.

In addition, they will be given spellings for the week. We would appreciate if you could explore these with your child at home, by not only discussing the spelling rule, but also the meaning of the words; this will enable the children to learn to use them in context.

They are also asked to continue to practise their times tables and read at least 3 times outside school. Please check their reading records weekly and, if you have time, hear them read and enjoy their books with them! We aim to instil a life-long love of reading in the children!

'THE BIG BANG' Out of Africa

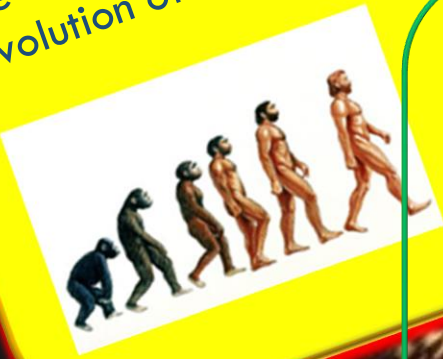
As scientists we will ...
