



Dear Parents, Carers, Governors and Friends,

This week started with an exciting sharing assembly. The children proudly showed their learning from World Book Day, all of which was inspired by the book 'Monstersaurus' which Miss Wood read to the children in assembly the previous week. Every class had taken part in something completely different - well done everyone.

On Tuesday and Wednesday we held our re-scheduled parent consultation evenings. The children were all excited knowing that their parents were coming in to look at their learning and talk to their teacher. I hope you found the meetings useful and that you have a clear understanding of the progress your child is making and how to support them.
