Dear Parents/ Carers/ Governors and Friends,

It was so lovely to be able to welcome Year 6 back on Monday and Tuesday this week. They all seem so much more grown up than when we last saw them.

You may have seen on the news yesterday that all children are expected to be back in school from September. While we are very pleased about this announcement, as some of the children have been out of school for such a long time, we have now received further guidance about this. The guidance states that children should be in bubbles of no more than 30 and that the bubbles should not mix. This does present problems for us in terms of children entering and leaving the school site and how to manage break and lunch times safely. We are currently looking at how this may impact on the school day and will be in touch very shortly with further details.

School will be closing for the Summer Break for all children, including the children of Key Workers on Thursday July 16th. Please collect your child at your usual allocated time. We are not able to operate a holiday club as there will be building work going on in school. However, Valley Primary School is operating a holiday club from Monday 20th July to Friday 14th August, which children from Raglan are able to attend. The club will run for long days from 8am-6pm at a cost of £27 per day with Breakfast and evening snack included and short days from 10am-3pm at a cost of £14 per day. 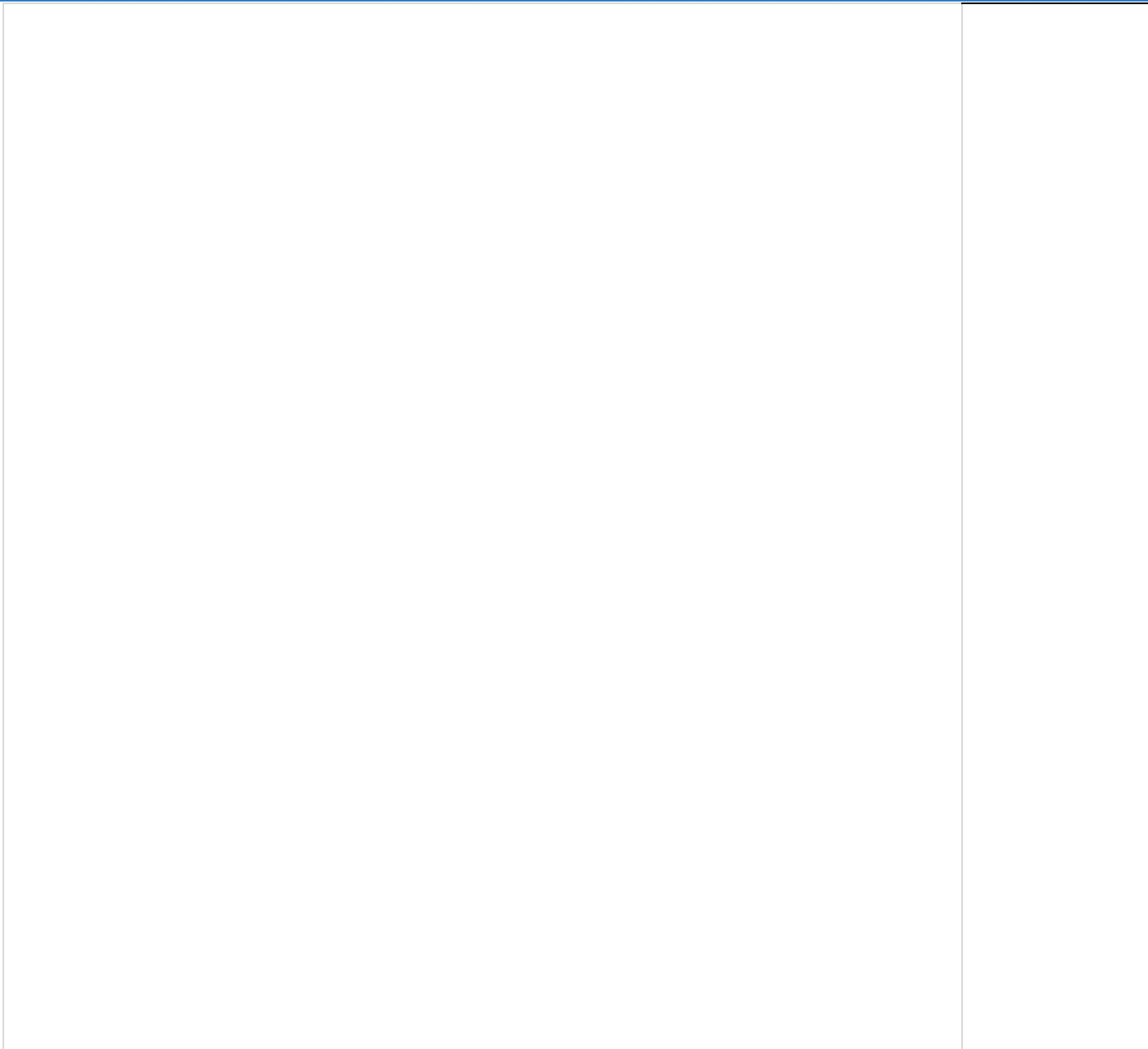
