



Dear Parents / Carers, Governors and Friends,

Judging by the weather this morning, it looks like summer might finally be over – if the weather continues like this next week, please make sure that your child has a coat in school.

A lot of parents have said how helpful they found the COVID update letter that I sent out last week. I will continue to keep you informed of any updates or changes that take place in school as a result of further guidance. This week we received guidance from Bromley and the NHS regarding symptoms and when children should or should not be in school. Unfortunately we will not be able to have our usual parent meetings this term either, so instead we will be sending out a short report detailing how your child has settled back into school, their progress and how you can help at home.

A few parents have asked me about how the children will catch up on specific areas of the curriculum that they have missed during school closure. Teachers have now assessed where the children are in their learning and will ensure that their planning addresses any gaps that have been identified. Some areas of the curriculum that are usually taught in specific year groups, such as elements of the sex and relationship curriculum, will be taught this year along with what would usually be taught this year. Miss Reid Smith will send a letter out about this shortly.

All teaching staff received training from Bromley Well being this week to support them to support children who may be finding the return to school a bit difficult. It was a very useful session and included a lot of practical strategies to use in the classroom. Support staff will also receive the same training very shortly.
