Intervention	Impact
Teacher led targeted additional support in reading, writing and maths	Identified children in Yr 4 and Yr 6 have received additional support in reading, writing and maths. All children have made at least expected progress.
Accelerated Learning Lead to advise on interventions and support for low attainers across KS1.	Worked across KS1 until March when we were required to work in consistent bubbles. Since then has given additional support to identified children in Yr 2. All children have made at least expected progress.
Additional Phonic Intervention	Additional member of staff in Yr 1 has provided targeted phonic support for identified children.

<p>ELSA training for staff member to provide SEMH support in school</p>	<p>Member of staff has completed ELSA (emotional, literacy, support assistant) training. Since she has completed her training she has been restricted to working across 1 year group bubble. She will be able to support children from across the school in September if restrictions are lifted.</p>
<p>Dyslexia training for 2 staff members - training to be cascaded to staff team</p>	<p>Trained members of staff have delivered remote training to all teaching and support staff. There will be an expectation that all classrooms will be dyslexia friendly from September.</p>
<p>Additional day of Learning Mentor time</p>	<p>The Learning Mentor has offered much needed support to individual children and families and has remotely supported families during lockdown.</p>
<p>Social skills groups</p>	<p>Social skills groups have run across KS2. Baseline and final questionnaires demonstrate that children who have attended social skills group feel more confident in social interactions and are happier in school.</p>
<p>Listening Ear</p>	<p>Trained members of staff continue to support children from across the school. This has been particularly important this year.</p>
<p>Financial assistance for residential visits and extra curricular activities</p>	<p>Despite the restrictions on educational visits for part of the year, a total of 26 educational visits took place. School subsidised the cost by £472</p>
